

VIEWPOINT ROUTE

The route consists of four viewpoints and can be traveled by car. To start the route, take the path behind the schools and continue on the right towards Molló de Sant Marc, a small privileged mountain, at 565 m, which houses the hermitage of the saint it is named for. This route features spectacular panoramic views. Continue to the viewpoint located at the exit of the village in the direction of Bel, before reaching the Font de Baix. Continuing along the Bel road and at kilometer 5, on the right we will find the third viewpoint. The final viewpoint is located in the village of Bel, which has an Islamic origin. Bel offers a beautiful, compact image amid pristine nature.

GASTRONOMY

At Rossell, you can taste magnificent traditional dishes made with local ingredients. This begins with the set of dishes that form the historical basis, such as the "olla" (pot), which offers a set of flavors evoking the masterful cuisine of yesteryear, fire on earth. At Carnival, the broth from the olla gives life to a flavourful rice dish. Rabbit with samfaina (ratatouille) is a true symbiosis of flavours and colours in a casserole. For dessert, we can enjoy ancestral recipes that include pastissets of angel hair (squash marmelade) or the celestial coca, made of ground almond, and, of course, the borraines or borage, and figs esbardades.

Rossell, at the northeast of the Baix Maestrat, 505 metres above sea level, is the gateway to the Tinença de Benifassà. It occupies an area of 75.26 sq km in the middle of nature and is home to about 900 inhabitants.

Rossell's population origins date back to Iberian times. Its Population Charter was granted in 1237 by Hug de Follalquer, master of the Hospitallers. It was first part of the Batllia (Town Hall) of Cervera, and in 1317 it was transferred to the Order of Montesa, Lord of Rossell until the 19th century. The town's participation in the War of the Reapers, at which time it was burned, and also in the Carlist Wars, is especially significant.

The municipality is made up of three population centres: the largest, Rossell, at the center of the area; in the eastern part, bordering the Sénia River, Les Cases del Riu; and in the far northwest, Bel. In addition, a large number of farmhouses that were inhabited until the mid-twentieth century can be found throughout the region.

A walk through Rossell's town allows you to discover the impressive Church of the Saints Joans. Leaving the Plaza de la Iglesia, we arrive at the "Molí Vell" Civic Center, which hosts exhibitions, meetings and other activities. Continuing along Mestra Saiz Street, we will see the Aulario "Lope de Vega", the square, and the Town Hall building.

Rossell is located in a privileged location for nature and environment, the Natural Park of the Tinença de Benifassà. It is one of the most unchanged territories remaining in the Valencian Community.

The annual cycle of festivals and traditions in Rossell allows guests to attend a wide variety of celebrations, all of which complement our special environment and our gastronomic and rural accommodation.








Rossell is located in a privileged location as the gateway to the Tinença de Benifassà Natural Park. Its environment has impressive biodiversity, with flora and fauna of great scientific value. Its unspoiled landscapes invite you to rest and relax.

The municipality's central landmark is the Font de Baix, a fountain located very close to the town, parallel to the channel of the Barranco de Requena. The Font de l'Argent is also a beautiful place with abundant vegetation and easy access.



WALKING AND CYCLING ROUTES

There is a wide range of short-distance circular routes that start and end in the town centre of Rossell, from a point off the road behind the municipal schools. These trails and bike routes are clearly marked to show highlights of scenic and rural architectural beauty and interest in Rossell. Around Rossell, you can take a low-level 4-kilometre route, suitable for all ages, through a local path starting from behind the municipal schools and ending at the emblematic Font de Baix.
